<u>Item 7.3 Muskoka Algonquin Healthcare – Local Share Contribution for Hospital Re-Development (Discussion)</u>

Mayor Hofstetter highlighted to Council the discussions surrounding the Almaguin Highlands Municipal Local Share Contribution to Muskoka Algonquin Healthcare (MAHC) for the Hospital Re-Development and noted the following:

- Under the proposed calculations Perry Township would be contributing approximately \$1.8 million dollars, \$150,000 per year, over 12 years;
- Approximately \$12 million is the municipal contribution for all of Almaguin Highlands;
- There is no mandate requiring municipalities to contribute to local share;
- On February 14th, 2023, the Council of the Township of Armour committed their portioned contribution of approximatley \$1.4 million.

Council made the following comments:

- Majority of Perry Township residents utilize MAHC hospitals and their services;
- A lot of money to raise each year, but not likely to fully 'opt-out';
- Would have preferred the Township of Armour had not committed, as a 'Regional' approach to contribute rather than an individual approach may have been more managable for remaining Almaguin Highlands municipalities;
- At \$150,000 per year, what is the anticipated tax rate increase based just on MAHC contribution;
- Does the tax rate increase for MAHC contribution impact potential tax arrears.

Staff advised that \$150,000 per year would be approximately a 5% tax rate increase. This increase on taxes and any non-payment would be subject to the Township's tax arrears process.

Council elected to not make any formal commitment to the MAHC local share contribution at this time. Once more Almaguin Highlands municipalities make their position known on the matter, will re-evaluate Perry's position.

<u>Item 7.4 2022 Pre-Audit Surplus Analysis (Information)</u>

Staff highlighted key aspects of the report. Council noted no concerns.

Item 7.5 5-Year Capital Budget Plan

Staff highlighted key aspects of the report. Council reviewed the 5-Year Capital Budget Plan and provided direction to staff on a variety of future capital projects.
